Executive Summary Provincial Team Selection Criteria

The Provincial Team is a group of Alberta-based skaters who are eligible for services and funding to support their athletic development. The criteria are set by the Alberta Amateur Speed Skating Association (AASSA) Skater Development Committee (SDC) and are sorted into tiers designed to show a pathway from the club level to the national team. The first tier is the Development Team, followed by the Provincial Team B and A tiers. The SDC uses the criteria to select the Provincial Teams for long and short track using times skated between June 1, 2019 and May 31, 2020. This summary is for quick reference. Full criteria, records and standards for the 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 seasons will be on the Albertaspeedskating.ca website later this summer.

Short Track Criteria

The Provincial Team is selected based on percentages of the Canadian senior record: 106% (A1). 108% (A2), 110% (A3), 112%(B1) and 115% (B2). The Development Team standard is 115% of the Canadian Junior record. Skaters qualify using the average percentage of any two distances.

Long Track Criteria

Long track qualification is based on the Olympic Oval A and B time standards. The Oval A Time for each distance will act as midpoint for the model with 3 time standards above the A standard (A1, A2, A3) and 3 time standards between the A and B standards (B1, B2 and B3 - Dev Team). Skaters qualify using the average percentage of any two distances.

Alberta Speed Skating (AASSA) has yet to confirm what funds will be able to be distributed among skaters who qualify for the 2020-2021 season. The SDC intends to distribute funds equally between long and short track. If funding is made available, athletes will hear from AASSA later this summer. Other team services like the provincial suits will continue unchanged unless otherwise communicated.
